





LOOKING BACK

For Ekklesia Seattle, the first quarter of 2014 was about getting legally and administratively established; it is now officially a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization.

For our family, the focus was on the transition and new relationships. We have made it a priority to try and build these relationships with anyone whom the LORD brought our way. This will always be part of the work of building a new church, so it was important to get off to a good start.
